- 3. Agenda item 3: The BOS reviewed the papers to be taught in B.A (Hons.) Islamic Studies and recommended to reshuffle paper BAIS-204 CA-I (Computer Applications) in Semester-II with Paper BAIS 304 EC-II (Economics) in Semester III (as that was before shuffling because the purpose is not being served appropriately with the earlier change) and accordingly changed the codes with effect from 2018-19; new codes are BAIS-204 EC-II (Economics) in Semester-II and Paper BAIS 304 CA-I (Computer Applications) in Semester III.
- 4. Agenda item 4: On the matter of restricting the admission of *Madaris* students to B.A (Hons.) Islamic Studies program or Certificate or Diploma in Persian Language instead of direct admission in M.A (Islamic Studies), the BOS discussed and decided that the



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same may be approved by forwarding it to AC meeting of the University and the latest same may be approved by for the earlier recognized *Madaris* if it is necessary according information may be updated to the earlier recognized *Madaris* if it is necessary according to the University regulations.

- 5. Agenda item 5: The BOS authorized the HoD of Islamic Studies to revise the copy of By. Agenda item 6: The BOS resolved that Academic Council Resolution AC 30 (5) dated Agenda item o: The Bob tall April 2016 (regarding the language of PhD theses in Islamic Studies), which stipulates April 2016 (regarding and its abstract should be written in English for submission,' should be that 'a thesis and its abstract translation of all non-English theses into English modified because it requires translation of all non-English theses into English.

 - The quality of translation is often not up to the mark, resulting in loss of meaning and originality of the theses.
 - The PhD supervisor checks and can vouch for only the original Urdu thesis. 0
- · However, students writing their theses in Urdu are required to submit a Summary of the theses in English
- This matter may be placed before the AC, so that the regulations are changed in effect and students writing their theses in Urdu can submit the same without translation.
- 7. Agenda item 7: Under the last point 'Any other item for discussion', the BOS has discussed two things:
 - The BoS considered the case of PhD scholar Mr. Irshad Alam that he has carried i. out all his research work in Urdu and his registration will finally expire on 14 December 2018, he may be allowed to submit his thesis in Urdu. His case may be treated as emergency case and may be submitted for the final approval of the competent authorities
 - In the old copy of the By-Laws of M.A (Islamic Studies), no credits were given ii. for the Grand Viva-Voce, however, the BOS recommended to add 4 credits for the same and total credits of all subjects should be final 100 credits.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks by the Chair to all the BOS members present in the meeting meeting.
