ISSUE OF MIGRATION CERTIFICATE TO THE PASS OUT STUDENTS FROM SODL:

CHARGES FOR ISSUE OF DUPLICATE IDENTITY AND ADMIT CARD:

### Resolution of BoM:

"The BoM approved the proposal of Dean, SODL to allocate code numbers to new academic programs, issue of Migration certificate to the passed out students of SODL and revision in the charges for issue of duplicate identity and admit card.

C. CHARGING OF FEES FOR ISSUE OF PROVISIONAL CERTIFICATE, MIGRATION CERTIFICATE AND DEGREE CERTIFICATE FROM THE ODL STUDENTS AT THE TIME OF ADMISSION ITSELF FOR THE CERTIFICATE/DIPLOMA/PG DIPLOMA PROGRAMMES AND IN THE FINAL YEAR OF UG AND PG PROGRAMMES.

### Resolution of BoM:

"Regarding charging of fees for issue of provisional certificate, migration certificate and degree certificate from the ODL students at the time of admission itself for the certificate/diploma/PG diploma programs and in the final year of UG and PG programs. it resolved to reduce the charges by half as mentioned in the agenda i.e. from Rs. 500 to Rs. 250."

The AC noted the above matters and resolutions adopted therein by the Board of Management as brought out in the agenda items."

AC 40 (5): TO APPROVE THE MINUTES OF THE JOINT MEETING OF BoS (CENTRE FOR FEDERAL STUDIES, AND ISLAMIC STUDIES) AND SCHOOL BOARD, SCHOOL OF HUMANITIES AND SOCIAL SCIENCES HELD ON 6<sup>TH</sup> MARCH, 2020

The House deliberated on the Minutes of the joint meeting of the BoS, Centre for Federal Studies and Department of Islamic Studies and School Board of SHSS

Prof. G.Y. Anjum suggested that earlier AC decision to accept the degree of 'Alimiayat' and 'Fazilat' asqualification for admission to B.A. and M.A. programs, respectively needs to be reviewed. The AC accepted this suggestion and resolved that the same be reviewed in the meeting of the School Board, whenever convened and the samel be presented to the next meeting of the AC.

AC 40 (6): TO APPROVE THE MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF STUDIES OF SCHOOL OF OPEN AND DISTANCE LEARNING (SODL) HELD ON 4/02/2020.

Dean, SODL informed the house that PG Diploma courses, listed below, as recommended by the BoS, designed and structured jointly in consultation with Department of Computer Science & Engineering shall be run through distance mode. These courses are big in demand and there will be no extra financial burden to start these programs.

After discussion, the AC resolved to approve the Minutes of the BoS of SODL along with Programmes Project Reports (PPR), course structures of the following programs to be started from July 2020/January 2021 session:

- 1. PG Diploma in Big Data Analytics
- 2. PG Diploma in Cloud Computing
- 3. PG Diploma in Internet of Things
- 4. PG Diploma in Cyber Security and Digital Forensics
- 5. Diploma in Professional Arabic
- 6. Certificate in Computer Hardware

It was decided to review the demand of these programmes and only those programmes who have good demand should be allowed to continue.

## Masters in Public Policy and Governance

(Approved by Joint meeting of BoS & School Board held on o6/03/2020)

#### **Bye-Laws**

Subject to relevant rules/bye-laws/ guidelines and other statutory decisions as laid down from time to time by the University and statutory bodies of the Government of India, Bye-laws governing the course are as follows.

#### Eligibility for Admission

45% marks in the aggregate in the Bachelors Examination recognised by the statutory bodies of India. The process of selection will be as determined/laid down by the Centre/University from time to time.

#### Duration

Four consecutive semesters (two years). However, students may be permitted to clear backlog paper(s) within a span of four years.

#### Attendance

75% attendance is mandatory for writing end semester exams.

#### **Examination & Evaluation**

Centre follows credit based letter grade system.

- Pass percentage will be 40% (i.e. in P in letter grade system) in each paper.
- The ratio between the end-semester examination and internal assessment marks will be 75:25.
- Internal assessment/performative assessment is a continuous process. In each semester, students are expected to write two term papers either essays/field study based reports, literature review, policy documents appraisal or as instructed or specified by the course teachers, followed by two seminar presentations.
- Before submission of dissertation, students will be required a make a pre-submission presentation for peer comments and improvements.

## Supplementary and improvement examination

There will be supplementary/ improvement examination after each semester/ annual examination. A student may have choice to appear in the backlog papers in the supplementary examination or in the subsequent regular semester/ annual examination with a prescribed fee as laid down by the University from time to time.

A student who cleared all the papers of a semester/annual examination of a programme/course will be eligible for Improvement Examination on the following conditions:

A student shall be eligible to appear at the improvement examination if he/ she (i) secures 'C' and 'P' grade in any course.

- (ii) For the purpose of determining the SGPA/CGPA, the better of the two performances (regular and improvement) in the examinations shall be taken into consideration.
- (iii) The supplementary examination will be held within one month of declaration of result.
- (iv) The improvement examination will be allowed only once within one year of the date of the original examination.
- (v) The marks/ grades scored by the students in the improvement examinations shall not be considered for award of ranks, medals, prizes etc.
- (vi) The students who will take Repeat/ Supplementary Examinations, will not be entitled to be considered for the award of medals, prizes, and ranks, etc.

## Re-evaluation of Answer books

Students may be allowed to seek re-evaluation of his/her answer book by submitting a written application, along with necessary fee, within one week after declaration of results. Re-totalling of marks examinations will be allowed within one week from the date of declaration of results.

## Promotion criteria from semester/ annual examination

A student will be required to clear minimum 50% of his/ her papers in a semester/annual examination to be eligible for promotion to the next semester/ year.
