The meeting started with recitation from the Holy Quran by Mr. Syed Irfan ul Haque.

The Chairman welcomed all the Members especially Prof. M.N. Doja, Director, IIIT Sonipat who attended the meeting virtually despite his busy schedule. Then he congratulated all the fraternity of the Hamdard Pharmacy (SPER) especially Dean, HoDs and Faculty members for retaining No. 1 position in India in NIRF Ranking 2022 for consecutive four years in a row, but simultaneously he was cautious over fall in ranking of Jamia Hamdard under the university category as compared to last year, therefore, he informed the house that very soon he will arrange a meeting with Prof. S.K. Aggarwal, Former Chairman, UPSC; one of the experts in our NAAC preparation team, to advise and supervise the 4<sup>th</sup> cycle NAAC preparation and submission of SSR, etc. to NAAC.

The Chairman, further, informed the house that SSR (Self-Study Report) is almost ready for submission to the NAAC, however, he reiterated that the assessment of NAAC this time would be different than that of the previous years as the data will count 75% and Committee Report 25% so the data is very important and scoring 3.26 and more depend on it. He has, therefore, requested again to all concerned for extending their full support to the Criteria Coordinators and those who are associated directly / indirectly with the University NAAC preparation team, especially Office of the Director/Dy. Director, IQAC / Research & Development Cell.

Since the agenda of the meeting was voluminous, the Chairman after the short brief address to the house, requested the Secretary to start the official proceeding of the Standing Committee. The Secretary thanked the Chairman and started the proceeding of the house by taking agenda item one by one as under:

SC 160 (1): TO CONFIRM THE MINUTES OF THE 159<sup>TH</sup> MEETING OF THE STANDING COMMITTEE OF THE ACADEMIC COUNCIL HELD ON 6<sup>TH</sup> APRIL, 2022.

"Since no comments were received, the SC resolved to confirm the Minutes of the 159<sup>th</sup> Standing Committee of the Academic Council held on 6<sup>th</sup> April, 2022 as brought out in the agenda as Annexure-SC-160 (1) I."

SC 160 (2): CONFIRM THE ACTION TAKEN REPORTS OF THE 159<sup>TH</sup> MEETING OF THE STANDING COMMITTEE OF THE ACADEMIC COUNCIL HELD ON 6<sup>TH</sup> APRIL, 2022.

"The members perused the action taken reports submitted by the concerned HoDs / Deans / Chairmen of Committees / Officers and after deliberations, resolved to confirm the Actions Taken Report of the 159<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Standing Committee of the Academic Council held on 06/04/2022 as brought out in the agenda".

SC 160 (3): TO APPROVE THE MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF STUDIES, DEPARTMENT OF CHEMISTRY, SCHOOL OF CHEMICAL AND LIFE SCIENCES & TECHNOLOGY (SCLS) HELD ON 23/05/2022.

HoD, Chemistry briefed the house on the matters discussed and subsequent decisions taken by the BoS in respect of adoption of FYUP as per NEP-2020 guidelines (For Multiple Entry and Exit in Academic Programmes offered in HEIs) from the forthcoming academic year i.e. 2022-23.

The Chairman was of view that CBCS is fine, and we can allow the migration of students from other Institutions / Universities in second year, if there is any vacancy exists as in some cases, as has been reported that the enrolled students leave before the completion of the course resulting in financial loss of the university. In such cases, the students having 85% and above credit points reserved may be considered as the eligibility for the migration as per NEP-2020. He has, therefore, urged the CoE to expedite the ongoing process to set up the 'Academic Bank Credits (ABC)' and be a part of 'National Academics Depository (NAD)' - an initiative of Govt. of India under MoE for providing online store house duly digitized and certified for all academic awards viz. certificates, diplomas, degrees, mark-sheets, credit points etc. which is equally

important for NAAC rating and also for policy guidelines, hence, it is required to be uploaded on the university website.

"The members fully agreed on the above observations made by the Chairman and noted with request to the Director, IQAC and the CoE to take up this matter on priority. After that, the SC resolved to approve the Minutes of the Board of Studies, Department of Chemistry, SCLS held on 23/05/2022"

SC 160 (4): TO APPROVE THE MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF STUDIES, DEPARTMENT OF TOXICOLOGY, SCHOOL OF CHEMICAL AND LIFE SCIENCES & TECHNOLOGY (SCLS) HELD ON 24/05/2022.

Prof. S. Raisuddin, HoD, Toxicology briefed the house on the matters discussed and subsequent decisions taken by the BoS, especially the introduction of One Year Certificate Course in Forensic Science and Two Years full time M.Sc. (Forensic Science) from the academic session 2022-23, and accordingly the requirement of faculty (01 Associate Professor & 02 Assistant Professors) with Forensic Science / Toxicology background.

The Chairman was of view that we should be very clear, while recommending / approving the teaching / non-teaching positions as allocation of funds to fill such positions need to be specified, whether, the positions created under General (UGC) or SFS category, as we have to adopt the MoE module to prepare our balance sheet which will be subject to the scrutiny under forensic audit.

The SC also discussed the Vision & Mission as passed by the BoS for the Department of Toxicology and urged all the HoDs to come up with the vision & mission of their Departments as it is one of the requirements of NAAC and get it posted on the wall on the main entrance of the Department along with the names of the HoDs & Deans (in Deans' Office) who served previously indicating their tenures.

"After deliberations, the SC resolved to approve the Minutes of the Board of Studies, Department of Toxicology held on 24/05/2022 and also approved for creation of two positions of Assistant Professors under SFS category in the Department of Toxicology for the courses to be introduced in Forensic Sciences beyond the current sanctioned strength of the SCLS subject to the approval / confirmation of the FC and the BoM of JH."

SC 160 (5): TO APPROVE THE MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF STUDIES, HAMDARD INSTITUTE OF INTERNATIONAL STUDIES (HIIS) UNDER SCHOOL OF HUMANITIES & SOCIAL SCIENCES (SHSS) HELD ON 19/07/2022.

During the discussion, the Chairman suggested that curriculum of M.A. (International Studies) course should be designed in a way to cover MENA (Middle-East/North African) countries as specializations which include, Algeria, Egypt, Libya, Morocco, Tunisia, Iraq, Iran, Israel, Kuwait, Jordan, Lebanon, Syria, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Oman, Bahrain etc. as it is mandated by the MEA, Gol which consists of more than 30 countries.

SC 160 (13): TO APPROVE THE REVISION IN THE COURSE CURRICULUM OF MASTER IN PUBLIC HEALTH (MPH) FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2021-22 OFFERED AT HAMDARD INSTITUTE OF MEDICAL SCIENCES AND RESEARCH (HIMSR).

"The SC resolved to approve the revision in the course curriculum of Master in Public Health (MPH) as recommended by the BoS, Department of Community Medicine in its meeting held on 01/09/2021 from the academic year 2022-23 instead of 2021-22."

SC 160 (14): TO DISCUSS THE DRAFT POLICY FOR RECRUITMENT OF FOREIGN FACULTY AT JAMIA HAMDARD.

Prof. S. Raisuddin, Director, IQAC, who was the Chairman of the three members draft Committee that formulated the policy for recruitment of foreign faculty at Jamia Hamdard, told the house that the said Committee deliberated in detail on pursuing policies of other reputed institutions such as IITs and accordingly,

drafted a policy covering all aspects and the *modus operandi* to implement it successfully at Jamia Hamdard, if adopted.

The Chairman also told the house that it was very much needed for Q.S. and TIMES ranking, THE rankings and Govt. of India is also encouraging the higher institutions to come up with such a policy to pave the way to recruit foreign faculty in Indian Universities.

Prof. M.N. Doja was of view that first option is that we should engage such foreign faculty virtually (online), and if it succeeds then offer contract for one semester in physical mode so as to have minimum impact on finances.

The house was of view that although it is a good suggestion, but for rating / ranking, it will not be counted by any govt. / non-govt. agencies.

"After deliberations, the SC resolved to adopt the recommendation of the draft Committee that formulated a detailed policy to facilitate and guide the process of recruitment of foreign faculties at Jamia Hamdard subject to the approval / confirmation of the FC and the BoM of JH. Further resolved to reduce the eligibility criterion for hiring foreign faculty in any Department of JH from 10 years to 5 years of its establishment."

SC 160 (15): TO CONSIDER THE REPORT / PROPOSAL SUBMITTED BY THE PROF. N. RAVICHANDRAN, CHAIRMAN OF THE COMMITTEE DULY CONSTITUTED TO DELIBERATE ON THE FEASIBILITY TO COMMENCE VOCATIONAL PROGRAMMES THROUGH THE PROPOSED CENTRE FOR VOCATIONAL STUDIES IN ALL OF THE SCHOOLS OF JAMIA HAMDARD.

Prof. Ravi Chandran briefed the house on the concept report drafted to run the existing and proposed vocational courses through Centre for Vocational Studies (CVS) and role and scope of other 'Centres' / 'Department' under the new School of Vocational Education, Entrepreneurship and Training (SVEET) proposed to be established in future once the permission from the NSDC is obtained and the subsequent MoU/Agreement between JH and NSDC is signed.

The Chairman, further, explained the house that how the 'CVS' and 'SVEET' will work. There is a course of Nursing Attendant which is run in joint collaboration with BEB, whereas, the training is imparted to the admitted candidates and certificate issued after the successful completion of the course/training programme jointly by the RCN and the BEB.

He further said that the proposed School of Vocational Education, Entrepreneurship and Training (SVEET) will be established to amalgamate all such vocational courses / training programmes run either through the involvement of Schools/Departments of JH or HVKC, Moradabad or jointly in collaborations with outside agencies like Tech Mahindra Foundation (TMF), Etrain Education Pvt. Ltd., BEB etc.

The Chairman also took the opportunity to acknowledge with thanks the kind of support provided by the TMF through its training centres / hospitals to our Para Medical Students for their clinical training / posting during the COVID-19 pandemic.

The SC noted this development and recorded its deep appreciation for Tech Mahindra Foundation and recalled the tremendous work done by TMF under the able guidance and leadership of Mr. Anand Mahindra, one of the prominent face of Indian industrialists and a renowned Philanthropist.

### "After the above observations and discussions, the SC resolved to approve the following:

- Creation of School of Vocational Education, Entrepreneurship and Training (SVEET), in principle, along with the following 'Centres' and 'Departments' under the SVEET in phased manner as proposed by the above Committee subject to the approval of the AC and the BoM:

The SC resolved to refund the payment charged from Group 'B', 'C' & erstwhile Group 'D' regular employees of Jamia Hamdard as cost of admission application forms for their children / wards in the academic year 2021-22, but from the academic year 2022-23 and onwards restricted this facility of refunding / reimbursement the cost of admission application forms of the children & wards of JH regular employees belonging to Group 'C' & erstwhile 'D' category only.

# SC 160 (17): TO DISCUSS THE PROPOSAL RECEIVED FROM THE ETRAIN EDUCATION PVT. LTD. DELHI W.R.T. INDUSTRY-ACADEMIA PARTNERSHIP BY SETTING UP CENTRE OF EXCELLENCE AT JAMIA HAMDARD TO PROVIDE TRAINING AND CERTIFICATIONS BY IT GIANTS LIKE MICROSOFT, APPLE, AND IBM TO JAMIA HAMDARD / NON-JAMIA HAMDARD STUDENTS.

The Chairman briefed the house on the ongoing up-gradation project which is underway to up-grade / modernize our Computer Centre under SEST and after completion, we will be able to utilize it in full capacity by our teachers, students as well as other IT companies which have shown their interest to work jointly to start certificate programmes in IT. Etrain Education Pvt. Ltd. Delhi is one the such companies which has sent its LoI to Jamia Hamdard for jointly setting up a Centre of Excellence at Jamia Hamdard for trainings and certifications by IT Giants like Microsoft, Apple, and IBM to JH and Non JH students as well.

The members found this proposal very much viable and hoped that our teachers and students particularly will be benefited by such association and after deliberation, the SC resolved to approve the proposal, in principle' as brought out in the agenda and authorized the Vice-Chancellor for further action w.r.t. signing MoU / Agreement accordingly."

## SC 160 (18): TO DISCUSS THE PROPOSAL RECEIVED FROM THE TECH MAHINDRA FOUNDATION (TMF) TO RUN SOME PARA MEDICAL DIPLOMA COURSES IN JOINT COLLABORATION WITH JAMIA HAMDARD (JH)

Prof. Manju Chhugani, HoD, Para-Medical Sciences recalled the services provided by the TMF by allowing para medical students of Jamia Hamdard to its run hospitals for free of cost training during Covid-19, therefore, she found it very useful if TMF is associated with JH and some certificate / diploma level courses in health sectors are run jointly under skilled development initiatives in the Centre for Vocational Studies. It is expected that every year 25000 + candidates will be trained under such arrangement.

The SC discussed this proposal and found it as a value addition and resolved to approve it in principle, and authorized the Vice-Chancellor to take necessary actions in this regard.

The Chairman was also of view that financial sustainability needs to be addressed by all the stakeholders to secure our future prospect, therefore, he requested all the teaching / non teaching employees of Jamia Hamdard to be generous and donate their one day salary in the 'Jamia Endowment Fund', if he / she wishes, voluntarily to make a noble start. He further told the members that many renowned universities in world such as Oxford and Al-Azhar University have the endowment fund where crowd funding provided them long lease of life to sustain the growth in higher education and research.

The house deliberated this proposal in depth and was fully agree that fund accumulated will not be for general utilization (salary etc.), but to be used in strengthening the infrastructure to support teaching and research.
