### Report

### Home based nurse- led care for COVID-19 like illnesses

The world is facing the biggest crisis named COVID- 19 which is spreading exponentially all around the world. India now stands as one of the worst hit COVID-19 country in the world. Recent data shows that out of the total cases 80% are asymptomatic and no extensive management is required for such cases. These cases can be handled at home and advised to be connected with health care professional via telephone or other suitable mean, it clearly shows the need of trained home based care medical professional to manage mild/ asymptomatic case during their home quarantine period.

Doctors and nurses: especially nurses have been recognised as greatest saviour during this unprecedented situation. Nurses are crucial at every the level of health care and can be the best suited for effective and efficient management of COVID-19 patients at home like hospital. This innovative idea was shared by Prof. (Dr.) Manju Chhugani for Online training of nurses to practice home- based care during this unprecedented situation with Dr. K.K. Aggarwal (President, Heart Care Foundation of India) who carried it forward with his diligent team. Dr. K.K. Kalra, Director HCFI along with Prof. (Dr.) Manju Chhugani worked heavily for the initiating this training programme at earliest due to peak in cases is being noticed in India. They structured the training programme in a way best in order to benefit hundreds of nurses and millions of patients.

The coordinators of this programme are Ms. Preysi Chauhan, faculty of Nursing, Jamia Hamdard and Ms. Vandana Rawat, Manager, admin worked round the clock to make it really happen.

School of Nursing Sciences and Allied Health, Jamia Hamdard in collaboration with Heart Care Foundation of India inaugurated an Online **"home based nurse- led care programme for COVID-19 like illnesses"**, a 3 days training programme (July1 to July 3, 2020) which is thoughtful to train the nurses in providing essential care to COVID-19 like illnesses patients and their family. The programme is endorsed by Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University, Delhi.

The programme was organised on Zoom and streamed on Youtube too. Total 75 dignitaries and participants joined us and witnessed a virtual inauguration.

Programme started with Welcome address by **Dr. K.K. Aggarwal, President, Heart Care Foundation of India**. At First, Dr. K.K. Aggarwal welcomed the chief guest Padma Shri

based nurse led care for COVID- 19 like illnesses programme in this pandemic. Dr. K.K.

Aggarwal appreciated Prof. (Dr.) Manju Chhugani, Dean, SNSAH, Jamia Hamdard for

sharing very innovative idea and overall plan of programme. He explained that online

practical based training programme for nurses in India will focus on nurse's capacity to serve

at home with same efficiency as in hospital. Nurses undergoing this programme will be able

to serve the people who are required to be well supported for fast healing and recovery. He

also congratulated all the doctors on the auspicious occasion of Doctor's day.

Prof. (Dr.) Manju Chhugani, Dean, SNSAH, Jamia Hamdard highlighted about the Home based nurse led care for COVID- 19 like illnesses programme. She explained that although the program names as very basic but it will cover all the aspect of caring a COVID-19 patients presenting with mild symptoms. She further added the significance of certification of this program, which will be generated only after completing it thoroughly, passing self assessment test. The certificate will have approval from three big organisations and will count for the participants as unique and valuable.

Prof. Amarjeet Kaur, Director, University center for diasaster management studies, GGSIP university congratulated SNSAH, Jamia Hamdard and HCFI for this initiative and expressed the value of this course. She expressed the vital link of nursing with the other team members of medical professionals.

After virtual lamp lighting ceremony and Saraswati Vandana audio message of **Padma Shri Prof. (Dr.) Seyed Ehtesham Hasnain Vice Chancellor, Jamia Hamdard**. Prof. (Dr.) Seyed Ehtesham Hasnain in his presidential address mentioned about the mutation capacity of the virus and its uniqueness. He emphasised that COVID-19 being the worst pandemic in last hundred years can be controlled only by adopting best practices and preventive measures as laid by health organisation. 



### Report of the 7<sup>th</sup> National Webinar (7<sup>th</sup> JULY 2020)

### "CARING YOUR HEART, LIVER AND NERVOUS SYSTEM: AN APPROACH, DURING CORONA CoV2 PANDEMIC"

Jamia Hamdard organized webinar on "Caring Heart, Liver and Nervous System" amid SARS nCov2 pandemic and COVID-19. In continuation of Jamia Hamdard COVID-19 Series, School of Unani Medical Education and Research (SUMER) Jamia Hamdard organized the National Webinar on Caring heart, Liver and Nervous system during SARS nCov2 pandemic and COVID-19. The webinar attracted more than 500 registered delegates which include academicians, researchers, clinicians, scholars, students, Scientists, and medical officers from different parts of the country and abroad including Malaysia Iran, Sri-Lanka, UAE, Saudi Arabia, and South Africa.

The webinar was specifically designed to target the ignored issues related to patients who suffer from heart diseases, hypertension, diabetes mellitus, renal diseases, neurological disorders, but with the current corona pandemic and COVID-19 their routine problems and consultation is interrupted. The experts from modern medical sciences and Unani Experts along with reputed Physiotherapists enlighten with their expertise as to how to live with corona pandemic and to take care of illness while staying at home. She has served in various teaching positions in India including her services as an Assistant Professor in the College of Nursing GwaliorIndia.

- Aparna had participated in developing Training Modules for Midwifery Practices for **UNICEF**, which was published in 2001, by UNICEF Bhopal,India.
- Aparna is living and working in Ireland since 2002 as a Health Care Practitioner she has a deep and genuine interest in motivating parents to take charge of their physical & mental health and play an active role in their journey toparenthood.

Ma'am has dealt with the **Obstetric Telephone Triage during Covid 19.** She has left India in 2002 to work in National Maternity Hospital Ireland. She has focussed on how the care is being provided in antenatal period in Ireland during this pandemic. She has they have a system software by the name of **Robort's system for assessment of antenatal mothers. Thissystem generates primary set of questionnaire according to each trimester**. This software helps them to assess each parameter and pertaining no error which a humancan cause. She focussed on 3 levels of care which they provide in 3 main areas like Public Care, semi-privatecare and Private care. She enforced in her speech that there is no vertical transmission as such till now by any of the research fact. She focussed on 3 kinds of hospitalin Ireland which works for the prompt care of patients duringcovid-19.

She explained in a very beautiful way the levels of care being provided by them.

- **❖** Level 1- Imminent birth, Active bleeding, severe pain, Seizure, sepsis, No fetal movements, Respiratorydistress.
- ❖ Level 2-Suspected Preterm labour, Vaginal Bleeding, BP >160/100 (symptomatic), reduced fetal movements, SOB, Ectopic
- **❖** Level 3-Active labour, B.P 140/90, Abdominal pain, Bleeding
- **\Level 4-early labour, PPROM, PVspotting**
- **❖** Level 5-Minor ailments, Anti D, Bloodtest



symptoms of COVID-19infection.


The highest number of the births in the 9 months since the pandemic was declared are expected to occur in India, where 20.1 million babies are projected to be born between march 11 and December as warned by UNICEF. She even talked about the no evidence of vertical transmission from mother to fetus. She also explained about the **Effects of COVID-19 on foetus.** There are currently no data suggesting an increased risk of miscarriage or early pregnancy loss in relation to COVID-19.

Ma'am finished her session by the last point of discussion on Antenatal care being provided health professionals during Covid-19.

- ☐ She highlighted the point on antenatal care being provided on Covid -19 by the health care professionals. Women should be advised to attendroutine antenatal care, tailored to minimum, at the discretion of the maternal care provider at 12, 20, 28 and 36 weeks of gestation, unless they meet current self-isolationcriteria.
- ☐ For women who have had symptoms, appointments can be deferred until 7 days after the start of symptoms, unless symptoms (aside from persistent cough) become severe. Foetal Kick count to be maintained.

Our second last speaker was Ms. Mehru Nissa, who is currently working in Saudi Arabia. She took over the session at 12pm. She has worked for the period of 10 years in Rufaida College Of Nursing. She also dealt with the care being provided in antenatal period during covid-19 in Saudi Arabia. She focused on telemedicine and telephonic consultation in Saudi Arabia. The routine check up of mothers is being provided according to protocol with full protective gear.

- Our next speaker was Jamaal Fatima, assistant professor( Mental Health Nursing), Rufaida college of Nursing ,Jamia Hamdard. She has total work experienceof 11 years in total clinical and teachingexperience.
- ❖ Ms. Jamaal Fatima has dealt with the mental health of the mother. Currently, available literature has consistently shown an association between depression, anxiety during pregnancy andsmall for gestational age, low birth weight, and preterm delivery. During pandemics, careful and adequate support is necessary for all pregnant women including mental health aspect also. On top of the distress created by the spread of COVID-19, antenatal women are exposed to the risk of emotional instability and vulnerability due to multifaceted factors such as hormonal changes, changes inbody image, multiple maternal roles of women
- ❖ Ma'am dealt with general recommendation for antenatalmothers to reduce psychological distress like adequate diet which includes green leafy vegetables, protein, and carbohydrates.,ContinueIron and Folicacidtabletsprescribed by your doctor. Keep your contact only with persons near to you and who practice infection Control. It is good to stay at your home and involve in pleasurableactivities .Ask your doctor regarding sanitation practices at home. If you are concerned about your pregnancy, contact your ASHA or ANM or obstetrician over the phone.
- She also focused on role of partner and family.
- Ms. Jamaal Fatima concluded her session by likelihood that mothers during the COVID-19 outbreak are likely to experience heightened distress, identifying and addressing these should be a high priority for health careproviders.
- Awareness of and engagement with supports for perinatal mental health difficulties will better supportand protect perinatal mental health and well-being during thistime.



# POINT OF QUALITY CARE IMPROVEMENT (E-POCQI) WORKSHOP FOR NURSES

### **REPORT**

Rufaida College of Nursing, Jamia Hamdard in collaboration with Nationwide Quality of Care Network (NQOCN), India, organized 2 days workshop on "Point of Quality Care Improvement (e-POCQI) Workshop for nurses' from 15 to 16 February, 2021. The workshop was organized for Student Nurses and Nursing faculty with an objective to sensitize them about Quality care and working together in a team. More than 35 participants from School of Nursing Sciences participated enthusiastically.

In the inauguration of the workshop, Ms. Veena Sharma, Principal, Rufaida College of Nursing welcomed the gathering with the motivational address.

Prof.Ona Desai explained the objectives of the workshop.

Chief Guest of workshop Dr.Vikram Datta, President, NQOCN, India explained about Quality Improvement (QI) and Quality Improvement cycles. He explained that the health care delivery systems in evolving economies are grappling with resource crunch and heavy population loads. The options before the health care professionals is to assume charge and fix these problems using simple approaches which revitalize the system. Quality improvement is one such approach. Quality improvement strategies are a set of guiding principles which empower the health care delivery systems and focus on achieving synergy across all components and constituents. He encouraged the participants to take up some small projects and then proceed to bigger one.

Vote of thanks was proposed by Ms. Jamal Fatima, Asst. Professor, Rufaida College of Nursing.

The first session of the workshop was taken by Ms. Anjali Kaushik, National Mentor, NQOCN La Qshya on Picking a problem, forming a team and writing an

aim statement. The session started with a short power point presentation followed up by a focused group work with individual facilitators. Workshop participants then learnt to prioritize the problems using a prioritization tool, how to form an effective team to tackle the problem and form an aim statement to start their QI journey. Second session was conducted by Dr. Smriti Arora, Professor, Amity College of Nursing, Amity University on Analyzing and measuring quality of care. The teams learnt how to conduct a root cause analysis, using various tools like Cause and Effect Diagram or Fish Bone Diagram, 5 Whys, Pareto's Chart and a Process Flow Chart. This helps them to analyze the causes of the problem and identify possible solutions. The most important part on which the group work was focused was understanding the basics of process flow.

Ms. Mikki Khan, Assistant Professor, Rufaida College of Nursing conducted a session on Developing and testing changes. The teams learnt how to develop change ideas from the analysis tools, enlist them and prioritize them for testing using the structured format of the PDSA cycles. They were familiarized with the rationale of testing changes, ways to test and the rationale of testing changes before they become a part of the system changes.

A session on Sustaining improvement was conducted by Ms. Sreeja vijyan, National Mentor, NQOCN LaQshya. Through this session, the teams were familiarized with the ways with which they can prevent loss of the gains achieved. It is often seen that new QI teams work hard to achieve the aims.

**Day 2** of the workshop started with the Recap of the previous day by Ms. Anjali, Ms. Mikki, Dr. Smriti and by Sreeja Vijyan.

Then the teams were introduced to the QI project template and divided into small groups facility wise. Each group was facilitated by a facilitator. They identified their contextual problem, prioritized it, formed an aim, formed a team, analyzed the problem, identified change ideas and designed their first PDSAs.

The projects were then be presented by the group rapporteurs and critically appraised by the faculty.

In the valedictory session, Feedback from Faculty and students was taken. Ms. Veena Sharma, Principal, Rufaida College of Nursing, Jamia Hamdard explained how Jamia Hamdard can contribute to the national programmes. Concluding Remarks were given by Ms. Jamal Fatima, Assistant Professor, Rufaida College of Nursing. E certificates were distributed to the participants.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

Rufaida College of Nursing, School of Nursing Sciences and Allied Health, Jamia Hamdard organised two days webinar on "Covid-19 Issues and Challenges- Beginning till Date" on 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> of February 2021. The webinar was planned for one day that is on 17<sup>th</sup> February 2021 for B.Sc. 1<sup>st</sup> year and M.Sc. 1<sup>st</sup> year students and next day i.e. on 18<sup>th</sup> February, 2021 it was repeated for DGNM 1<sup>st</sup> year and Post Basic B.Sc. 1<sup>st</sup> year students. For this webinar Delhi Nursing Council accredited 5 credit hours per day.

Target audience for the webinar was first year students of all undergraduate and post graduate programs of Rufaida College of Nursing, School of Nursing Sciences and Allied Health, Jamia Hamdard namely DGNM, B.Sc. (Hons.) Nursing, M.Sc. Nursing and Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing, with an objective to understand and discuss the pandemic of COVID 19 infection in context of disease pathophysiology, clinical features & complications, treatment modalities, preventive strategies, vaccination strategies – overview & plan, current challenges & way forward and role of nurses in COVID 19 pandemic.

184 participants registered for the webinar and participated actively and enthusiastically. This webinar provided the platform for the students and faculty to clarify their doubts revolving around the disease, its management and vaccination.

The webinar was the result of the efforts of organising committee under the guidance of Ms. Veena Sharma, Principal, Rufaida College of Nursing. The committee consisted of faculty members, Ms. Seema Rani (Organising Secretary), Ms. Anju, Ms. K. Rebika Devi, Ms. Suchhanda Bhattacharya, Ms. Shaheen Khan, Ms. Sheeba A. Chacko, Ms. Vandana Dagar (Tutors, Rufaida College of Nursing) and M.Sc. Nursing IV semester students of 2019-2021 batch (Ms. Aasima Rashid, Ms. Mansi Dabola, Ms. Monika Bisht, Mr. Ritwik Masih, Ms. Deepika Kumari, Ms. Sini Thankachan, Ms. Julia Ningthoukhongjam, Ms. Trecy Benjaminn, Ms. N Grace Amitha, Ms. Soumya Viju, Ms. Garima Chaudhary).

The webinar started with the welcome address by webinar organising chairperson Ms. Veena Sharma led by introductory speech by Ms. Seema Rani. The webinar included four sessions deliberated by four different speakers from the fields of Medicine, Community Health Nursing and Community Medicine from various prestigious institutions.

The first session was taken by Dr. Shashi Mawar, Associate Professor, College of Nursing, AIIMS New Delhi on the topic 'Introduction and Magnitude of COVID-19', second session by Dr. Faheem, Associate Professor, Department of Community Medicine HIMSR, New Delhi

on 'Control and Current Issues: COVID-19 Across the Globe'. It was followed by a session on 'Role of Nurses during and post pandemic COVID-19' was elaborately explained by Prof. Urmila Bhardwaj, Dean cum Principal, School of Nursing Sciences and Research, Sharda University, U.P. Dr. Vineet Jain, Associate Professor, Department of Medicine, HIMSR, New Delhi explained 'Preventive Management of COVID -19'.

The Fun and Learn Health Activities (word puzzle, expressing oneself in shayri, yoga posture identification and sharing experiences by participants related to pandemic) and Laughter and Stretching Activity were conducted by Ms. Seema Rani in between the sessions. These sessions were highly appreciated by the participants as they broke the monotony. Also, participants could share their experiences of Covid-19 pandemic.

The sessions were followed by the question answer sessions. Each day ended with concluding remarks by Prof. Ona P. Desai, Dean, School of Nursing Sciences & Allied Health.

Pre-test and post-test on Covid-19 was conducted by the M.Sc. IV semester students before and after the webinar. Statistical analysis showed that there was marginal improvement in the knowledge of the participants. Although participants expressed that they got practical tips from the webinar. Participants also gave the significant feedback about the webinar informally during the interactive sessions as well as formally through predesigned feedback form. Participants were appreciative of the webinar topics and speakers for their expertise. They also suggested that similar webinar on Stress management among students; Management for Cardiovascular Diseases during Covid-19, Guidance regarding Covid-19 Vaccination Programme, Tuberculosis and First Aid should be conducted.

Dean gave concluding remarks at the end of the sessions. Nursing College in organizing a webinar on problems related to the current scenario of Covid-19 pandemic and especially Ms. Seema Rani for the innovative idea of Fun and Learn Health Activity.

#### **SESSIONS**

#### SESSION 1- Introduction and Magnitude of COVID-19

#### DR. SHASHI MAWAR

- Currently working as Associate Professor at College of Nursing, All India Institute of Medical Sciences, New Delhi.
- Graduated from All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS)
- Post-graduated in Community Health Nursing from Raj Kumari Amrit Kaur College of Nursing, Delhi University.

Topics covered under the session were "what is novel corona virus (SARS Cov-2) and COVID-19, human Corona virus origin, national response to Covid 19, Corona virus transmissibility, pattern of disease with progression, modes of transmission, risk factors, clinical features, diagnosis, health response to COVID-19, case definition, clinical criteria, probable case, suspect case and other epidemiological aspects of Covid-19.

After the session Question Answer session was held, where the participants resolved their doubts and concerns, the appropriate solutions were given for the queries by the speaker.

#### SESSION 2- CONTROL AND CURRENT ISSUES: COVID-19

#### DR. FAHEEM AHMED

Topics covered under the session were related to control and current issues in managing the pandemic including strategic approach of lockdown, cluster containment, containment zone, testing methods and strategies in India and other countries, routine surveillance in containment zone and screening at points of entry. In hospital settings, testing on demand, rapid antigen detection test for COVID-19, validity of the test, treatment guidelines for admitted patients and home care were discussed. Guidelines for international arrivals, sociocultural challenges, prevalent diseases and national programs, health impacts of working from home, impact on children and issues related to vaccines were explained.

After the session, the participants asked their queries regarding the topic and their concerns regarding COVID-19,including if they could go to the clinical areas as a part of their academic requirement.

#### SESSION 3- ROLE OF NURSES DURING AND POST PANDEMIC: COVID-19

Topics covered under the session were: introduction, important domains for covering nurse's role post pandemic, key challenges faced by nurses during pandemic, major roles of nurse post pandemic Covid 19, severe complex lessons for future, error and illusion should be expected, pertinent knowledge is critical, teach the human condition, nursing practice and education to frame and prepare for the post-covid-19 pandemic future, public health challenges post in covid-19.

After the session question answer session was held, where the participants were allowed to ask queries regarding the topic and their concerns regarding COVID-19, the answers for the queries were given by speaker and the participants were satisfied after the session. Student participants asked questions about resuming the classes after lockdown and their safety concerns.

Topics covered under the session were Introduction and epidemiology, Global COVID -19 dash board, modes of spread of COVID-19, transmission, prevention, different types of masks, efficacy of face covering in prevention of SARS COV-2 transmission, social distancing, hand hygiene, precautions during work, general activities precautions, vaccine—the ultimate prevention, vaccine hesitancy and vaccine advantage.

Following the session questions were asked by the participants regarding Covishield, Covaccine, transmission to infants, use of mask, psychological impact of Covid 19, complications of Covid 19, etc. this Question Answer session went on for about an hour on both days. The answers for the queries were given by speaker enthusiastically and the participants were hugely satisfied.



She informed that the idea of organizing the workshop came while working on the moderation of question papers and it was felt that brushing up of the knowledge and skill for evaluation and measurement is required for the faculty members.

The keynote address was given by Prof. (Dr.) M. A. Jafri, Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, Jamia Hamdard. He appreciated the efforts of the organizers for the Faculty Development Programme. He emphasized the importance to conduct such workshops on a regular basis so as to improve the quality of education. He also said that the theme is very relevant in the current scenario of education during Covid 19 pandemic.

Report of eco-club for the year 2020 was also released by the dignitaries.

In the end, vote of thanks was proposed by Ms. Anjali Kaushik, Organizing Secretary of the workshop.



DAY 1: March 2, 2021

#### SESSION I- CONCEPTS, PRINCIPLES AND MODELS OF EVALUATION

Dr. Monika Auplish started her session by highlighting on the meaning and importance of evaluation. Evaluation is a process of collecting information on the basis of which judgments are formed, which in turn are used for taking decisions. Therefore, three phases of evaluation are: **Information gathering**, **Forming judgments and Making decisions**. She discussed about principles of evaluation. She further stated that there are different models of evaluation.

**CIPP Evaluation Model** is developed by Daniel Stufflebeam. CIPP is an acronym for-Context, Input, Process and Product.

**Kirkpatrick's Four Level Model**- According to this model, evaluation should always begin with level one, and then should move subsequently through levels two, three,

and four. She stated that the Kirkpatrick Model is probably the best known model for analyzing and evaluating the results of training and educational programs.

#### SESSION II- BLOOM'S TAXONOMY OF EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

Dr. Monika Auplish described about Bloom's Taxonomy of Educational Objectives, given by Benjamin Bloom, an educational psychologist in 1956. She pointed that Bloom's Taxonomy is a hierarchical order of cognitive skills that helps teachers teach and students learn. She has explained about three domains named as cognitive, Affective and Psychomotor domains. She stated that blooms taxonomy was revised by Lorin Anderson in 1990 which is now widely used.



#### SESSION III- CONSTRUCTION OF OBJECTIVE TYPE TESTS - MCQS AND MRQ

(Construction of Objective type tests, True or False and Match the following)

Dr. Deepika Khakha started her session with an ice breaking activity. She emphasized that high quality assessment is essential in all assessments. She explained about guidelines and advantages of true -false questions. A true or false items can be written in any of the three forms: simple, complex or compound. Answer can consist of two choices (simple), more than two choices (complex), or two choices plus a conditional completion response (compound).

She stated that in matching type of questions we have to match column of terms (stimuli) on the left side of the work sheet with another column of terms (responses) on the right. For each stimuli term, there is a response term that somehow relates to the stimulus. She discussed guidelines for matching type of questions.



# SESSION IV- SKILL SESSION I- CONSTRUCTION OF OBJECTIVE TEST (GROUP ACTIVITY AND DISCUSSION)

Ms. Seema Rani conducted an activity on construction of objective test. The participants were divided in four groups and they were given a subject to make the questions. They were asked to construct different types of objective test like MCQ'S, Matching items, Fill in the blanks, true-false items in given time. Later these questions were evaluated on the basis of given criteria.



#### **SESSION V-ITEM ANALYSIS**

Prof. (Dr.) Raminder Kalra reflected on item analysis which is a process which examines student responses to individual test items in order to assess the quality of those items and of the test as a whole. She explained about characteristic of Item Analysis i.e. Difficulty Value and Discriminating Power.

She discussed about various formulas and calculation of difficulty level and discrimination index. She explained further about process of item analysis.

#### **SESSION V- SKILL SESSION II- PERFORMING ITEM ANALYSIS**

Ms. Seema Rani led the group activity and discussion where participants were actively engaged in performing item analysis.



DAY 2: March 3, 2021

#### **SESSION I- CONSTRUCTION OF SHORT ANSWER TYPE QUESTIONS**

Dr. Vanita Anand enlightened upon the construction of short answer questions. It is typically composed of a brief prompt that demands a written answer varying in length from one or two words to a few sentences but usually short. In contrast to objective type tests, these are most often used to test basic knowledge of key facts and terms as well as can also be used to test higher thinking skills, including analysis or evaluation.

Short answer questions (SAQs) tend to be open-ended questions and can be used in both formative and summative assessment. SAQs may take a range of different forms such as short descriptive or qualitative single sentence answers, diagrams or graphs with explanations, filling in missing words in a sentence, list of answers.

The common terms used in construction of short answer questions are- define, enumerate, enlist, classify, differentiate etc.



#### **SESSION II- CONSTRUCTION OF ESSAY TYPE QUESTIONS**

After SAQs, Dr. Vanita discussed the long answer questions or what we say essay tests which are still commonly used as tools of evaluation. These are used when certain outcomes of learning e.g. organizing, summarizing, integrating ideas and expressing are to be evaluated which cannot be satisfactorily measured through objective type tests. An essay test may give full freedom to the students to plan their own answer and to explain it in their own words with considerable freedom to select, organize and present ideas providing a better indication of real achievement in learning, providing a clue to nature and quality of the pupil's thought process, whether the manner of presentation is coherent, logical and systematic, and how they concludes. In other words, the answer of the pupil reveals the structure, dynamics and functioning of pupil's mental life.

Essay type questions may seek selective recall, evaluative recall, comparison, decision—for or against, causes or effects, summary of some unit of the text or of some article, analysis, statement of relationship and application of rules or principles in given situations.

The main advantages of essay tests are easy to prepare, administer and usable in all subjects. Limitations include no scope for larger sampling of the content, encourage selective reading, scoring may be affected by a number of variables like spelling, handwriting, grammar, length of the answer etc., mood of the examiner, inter and intra examiner variability and halo effect.

# SKILL SESSION III & IV- SHORT ANSWER & LONG ANSWER TYPE QUESTION CONSTRUCTION (GROUP ACTIVITY AND DISCUSSION)

Skill session was conducted by Ms. Bindu Shaiju, Associate Professor, Rufaida College of Nursing. The participants were divided into four groups and were assigned to make short answer questions and long answer questions on a given subject. The participants constructed short answer and long answer type questions in given time period as per the norms of test construction. The questions were critiqued on the basis of standard criteria and the shortcomings were discussed in detail. Ms. Bindu Shaiju shared a standard checklist for assessing the short answer questions and long answer questions. This session encouraged the members to actively participate and discuss their issues while constructing short answer and long answer type questions.



# QUIZ- (MODELS OF EVALUATION, BLOOM'S TAXONOMY OF EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES & CONSTRUCTION OF OBJECTIVE TYPE TESTS)

A quiz was organized by Mr. Eke Lama Tamang, Assistant Professor, Rufaida College of Nursing, on models of evaluation, bloom's taxonomy and construction of objective type tests. The participants were divided into four groups and were asked to select five chits depicting the question numbers to be asked. Questions were asked from them as per the number given on their chit. The participants were very excited and gave their best possible answers to win the quiz.



#### SESSION III- OSCE AS A CLINICAL EVALUATION TOOL

Prof. (Dr.) Manju Chhugani started her session by highlighting the importance of OSCE (Objective Structured Clinical Examination), an assessment of skills carried out in a well —planned ,structured and objective way which is used increasingly in nurse education now a days, as nursing is a practice based profession, it is essentially required to assess students' clinical skills. The construction of an OSCE requires the preparation of checklists and skill stations for each skill to be evaluated. Steps to prepare an OSCE includes identification of competencies to be evaluate, deciding an activity that addresses each of the competency and mapping out the plan of the stations. A predesigned series of stations (usually 10-20 stations) where students rotate and answer questions orally /written or perform assigned task in the given time limit (e.g. BP monitoring of a standardized patient) while being observed using standard checklists by trained evaluators at each stations.

At the end of the session, Prof. (Dr.) Manju Chhugani organised a live demonstration of evaluation using OSCE which was very beneficial for the participants for planning OSCEs in their fields.



# SESSION IV- CHARACTERISTICS OF GOOD TEST: HOW TO PREPARE A GOOD QUESTION PAPER

Ms. Veena Sharma enlightened upon the characteristics of a good test. She has discussed how to construct questions in a test with examples. The questions must have some certain characteristics including relevancy, clarity, concise and crisp. The questions have to be purposeful and guiding (not leading), stimulate thinking and single dimensional. As the old proverb says, Good questions are cunning, they encourage thinking and reasoning. Case scenarios, as they are used in current pandemic condition, should be made according to the educational objectives of the examinee including their frame, level and duration. Ms. Veena Sharma highlighted the practical tips of setting a question paper which are- clear and complete instructions, marks distribution, neither too lengthy nor short, neither easy nor difficult and should cover entire syllabus instead of certain topics. These techniques and tips discussed by Ms. Veena Sharma gave a clear insight on making of tests and question papers which is practically useful for the teaching faculty.







### SESSION V- INNOVATIVE TOOLS FOR ONLINE ASSESSMENT & HANDS ON PRACTICE – ONLINE TOOL

Dr. Shiv Kanya Fuloriya enlightened everyone about Innovative tools for online assessment. She described purposes of assessment. She brought forth 75 online assessment tools which can be used in assessment. Some of them are as follow:




She enlightened about the pros and cons of various tools such as EDMODO, QUIZLET, KAHOOT, CLASS Marker






### International Seminar on 'Global Perspectives on Diabetes Mellitus: Focus on A Century of Insulin Discovery'
